

Margaret Crotty has served in executive leadership roles in both the not-for-profit and private sectors in the areas of education and public health. She is currently the CEO of Partnership with Children, which works at the nexus of public health and education. Under her leadership, the organization has become the largest CBO provider of wraparound services in New York City's community school initiative, partnering with Robin Hood, the United Way, the NYC Departments of Education and Health and Mental Hygiene, and the NYS Office of Mental Health.

In 2008, Margaret launched and ran Save the Children's \$2 billion initiative to reduce child mortality in the developing world. Previously, she was the President and CEO of AFS-USA Intercultural Programs, formerly the American Field Service.

Margaret also spent many years working in for-profit education, notably as part of the original management team of the world's largest online English language school. Later she served as President of EF Education's higher education business, growing a network of international for-profit business schools. In these roles, she lived in Shanghai, Hong Kong and Paris. She has also lived in Indonesia on two occasions, working for McKinsey & Co. and for Save the Children.

Margaret graduated with honors from Princeton University. She has earned an MBA from Harvard Business School and a Master's Degree in Public Health from the Mailman School at Columbia University. She serves on several health and education boards, including those of Northwell Health System, Lenox Hill Hospital, Crutches 4 Kids, the Inner City Scholarship Fund, the Convent of the Sacred Heart, and the Middlebury Center for Social Entrepreneurship.
